High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. As we reintroduce face to face engagement, which is in addition to the ongoing virtual engagement, we will continue to follow government guidance on reducing the spread of Covid-19. What are we doing?

From the middle of August 2022, we began our early works for the construction of School Hill Bridge which included the demolition of some nearby structures. We will now be removing the structures' foundations and carrying out further utility and survey works to facilitate the design process of the new School Hill Bridge. The main construction works for the new School Hill Bridge are expected to commence in early 2023.

We will be carrying out CCTV drainage surveys along School Hill/Werner Terrace. Should our drainage surveys discover there is a blockage in the local drain network, strong jet washing will be used to flush the local drain system. These survey works will require traffic management in the form of a lane closure with two-way traffic lights.

We will also be carrying out overnight topographical surveys along Brackley Lane and School Hill/ Werner Terrace in late October. These works will require some overnight road closures as our team will be working directly on the carriageway. While these overnight road closures are in place, access will be maintained for residents and emergency services.

We will also be disconnecting any existing utilities that are located across the current bridge. To carry out these works, some temporary traffic management will be required.

When will these works take place?

A section of **School Hill/Werner Terrace** will be closed overnight between 8pm and 6am beginning Monday 24 October to Thursday 27 October 2022.

A section of **Brackley Lane** will be closed overnight between 8pm and 6am from Thursday October 27 and Saturday October 29 2022.

Due to circumstances outside of our control, such as weather, these dates may be subject to change.

Duration of works

A section of School Hill / Werner Terrace will be closed overnight for 3 nights beginning Monday 24 October 2022.

A section of Brackley Lane will be closed overnight for two nights in late October beginning Thursday 27 October 2022.

Early works for the construction of School Hill Bridge commenced in August 2022 and will continue throughout the autumn and winter.



The map below, shows the section of School Hill/Top of Werner Terrace that will be closed between 8pm and 6am for three nights. Access will be maintained for residents and emergency services.


